POSITION DESCRIPTION

The spray technician, under the supervision of the Golf Course Superintendent, performs chemical/fertilizer applications on golf course properties, including tees, greens, fairways, roughs, and landscape plant material. The spray technician is responsible for reading, understanding and keeping current with chemical labels and Safety Data Sheets (SDS). This position is also responsible for compiling preliminary reports of pesticide usage for the Golf Course Superintendent.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Performs routine safety inspections on all spraying and fertilizing equipment.

Maintains chemical storage and mixing areas in a neat and tidy manner.

Tracks chemical/fertilizer inventory.

Cleans, tests, properly calibrates and prepares all spray and fertilizer application equipment.

Safety – Comply with established safe work practices and attend to all safety-related training provided or made available by the Company.

Other duties as assigned
